

Open /Close by Day




- Of the 174 service requests that were created, 99 have been closed (this includes duplicate requests) with 75 remaining open.

- To date, there are 2,043 registered Brookhaven Connect users; this represents an increase of 342 users since the beginning of the year.



<u>ChatComm 911 Executive Overview:</u> September 1, 2020 – September 30, 2020

911 Answer Time: In September 2020, ChatComm 911 answered 94.2% of all incoming phone calls within ten seconds and 99.1% of all incoming phone calls were answered within thirty seconds.

Call Processing Time: This Month, ChatComm 911 processed 98.3% of all high priority calls for service and 97.5% of all low priority calls for service within sixty seconds.

Monthly Phone Call Volume: For the month of September 2020, ChatComm 911 handled a total of 28,593 phone calls.

- 71.4% (20,422) were incoming phone calls which are treated as potential emergencies and handled as 911 calls regardless of the line the call is received on.
 - o 12,018 of those calls were received on the 911 trunks. 1,926 of the 911 calls received were abandoned 911 calls (where the caller disconnects the line prior to speaking with a calltaker).
 - o 6,478 calls were received on administrative and alarm lines but treated as 911 calls.
- The remaining 28.6% (8,171) of the phone calls handled by ChatComm 911 in September 2020 were outgoing phone calls.

Overall Phone Call Volume: Since September 2009, ChatComm 911 has answered a total of 2,754,273 incoming phone calls. Of those calls, 1,730,567 (62.8%) were received on 911 trunks and 1,023,706 (37.2%) came in on 10digit phone lines.

Monthly Incident Volume: ChatComm 911 handled a total of 32,122 incidents in September 2020.

- 63.3% (20,318) of the incidents created were officer-initiated incidents, which include traffic stops, business & residential checks, and other calls created by officers.
- 32.8% (10,522) of the incidents were dispatched incidents.
- The remaining 1,282 (4.0%) of the incidents were transferred via CAD to Dekalb for EMS and Fire Dispatch.
- Sandy Springs incidents comprised 35.7% (11,476) of the total incident volume.
 - o 9,371 incidents were Sandy Springs Police Department incidents.
 - o 1,233 incidents were for Sandy Springs Fire Rescue.
 - o 872 incidents were EMS calls for service in Sandy Springs.
- Johns Creek incidents were 23.02% (7,394) of the total incident volume.
 - o 6,607 incidents were Johns Creek Police Department incidents.
 - o 460 incidents were for Johns Creek Fire Department.
 - o 327 incidents were EMS calls for service in Johns Creek.
- Dunwoody incidents accounted for 14.8% (4,746) of the total incident volume.
- Brookhaven incidents were 22.5% (7,224) of the total incident volume.
- Dekalb Fire and EMS (for the Cities of Brookhaven and Dunwoody) incidents were 4.0% (1,282) of the total incident volume.
 - o 712 incidents were Fire calls for service in Brookhaven or Dunwoody
 - o 570 incidents were EMS calls for service in Brookhaven or Dunwoody.

Overall Incident Volume: By the end of September 2020, ChatComm 911 handled 3,769,211 incidents since "golive" in September 2009. 3,353,773 (89.0%) of those were law enforcement incidents; 236,627 (6.3%) of those were fire department incidents; and 178,811 (4.7%) of those were EMS incidents.

EMD & EFD Compliance: For the month of September 2020, the quality assurance compliance score for EMD remains in compliance with levels set forth by the International Academies of Emergency Dispatch (90%).

Finance: September 2020

September 30, 2020 Financial Report in Brief

The September financial statements are presented in comparative form to provide context regarding various revenues and expenditures that are "seasonal" in nature. The significant General Fund revenues that are not typically received each month include (1) property taxes (billed Sept 1 and collected thereafter), (2) franchise fees (larger utility provider remits in 1st quarter of year with other utilities remitting quarterly), (3) business and occupational taxes (renewals are due April 30th), (4) insurance premium tax and fees (collected and remitted by State; Oct 15th), and (5) alcohol licenses. Operationally, the expenditures are not subject to "seasonal" variances, but the acquisition of capital items can be arbitrary from one year to the next.

General Fund Summary

Total General Fund revenues through September 2020 were \$4,798,317 more than they were this time last fiscal year. This is primarily due to Licenses & Permits increasing by \$6,263,106 compared to this time in the prior year mainly due to permits issued for couple of large projects during the current year. Motor Vehicle and Title Ad Valorem Tax (TAVT) increased by \$661,758 compared to last year due to change in State law effective July 1st, 2019, increasing City TAVT allocation. Other financing sources were less by \$628,566 compared to this time in the prior year due to hotels being impacted by the pandemic and significant decreases in Hotel/Motel revenue taxes received by the City. Business & Occupational tax decreased by \$323,531 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Investment earnings decreased by \$337,097 due to significant drops in market interest rates. Charges for services and fines & forfeitures also show noticeable decreases due to the pandemic amounting to unfavorable variances of \$326,526 and \$437,465.

General Fund expenditures decreased compared to last year at this time by \$1,259,280. The General Government expenditures increased by \$1,030,811 compared to the previous fiscal year at this time due to the purchase of the Brookhaven Heights property located at 1174 Pine Grove Ave. Expenditures for the police department were higher by \$371,896 compared to September 2019 mainly due the Council approved increase in Police salaries in FY 2019. Other financing uses decreased by \$1,308,370 mainly due to prior year transfer to the capital projects fund for additional costs related to the public safety building project. Recreation governmental function expenditures decreased in the amount of \$544,771 due to less expenditures compared to this time in 2019 for recreational supplies, parks maintenance costs, and professional services. Expenditures for Public Works decreased by \$399,773 compared to the previous year at this time mainly due to the QT building improvements and the I-285 Transit study costs in the prior fiscal year. Economic Development/Tourism expenditures decreased by \$308,451. This is mainly due to professional services cost for special events being accounted for in the Tourism fund in the prior fiscal year. In the current year special events professional costs are budgeted in the Culture and Recreation governmental function.





General Fund Balance Reserves

The City has reserved a portion of fund balance to account for City programs. The Tree Fund, Sidewalk Fund, and Police Donations are three examples of City programs that are preserved in the general fund.

Tree Fund Conservancy

Established via City Ordinance, Chapter 14, Section 14-47, the receipts or contributions are part of the "alternative compliance" with the City's tree ordinance. It is only after determination that recompense trees do not fit on a redeveloped site, would a contribution be made. Expenses are basically limited to the purchase/installation of trees in parks, right-of-ways, and other City-owned or leased property.
