Chatcom 911 Executive Overview: February 1, 2021-February 31, 2021

911 Answer Time: In February 2021, ChatComm 911 answered 94.9% of all incoming phone calls within ten seconds and 99.2% of all incoming phone calls were answered within thirty seconds.

Call Processing Time: This Month, ChatComm 911 processed 97.9% of all high priority calls for service and 96.3% of all low priority calls for service within sixty seconds. **Monthly Phone Call Volume:** For the month of February 2021, ChatComm 911 handled a total of 25,207 phone calls.

- 73.3% (18,485) were incoming phone calls which are treated as potential emergencies and handled as 911 calls regardless of the line the call is received on. o 10,911 of those calls were received on the 911 trunks. 1,995 of the 911 calls received were abandoned 911 calls (where the caller disconnects the line prior to speaking with a calltaker). o 5,799 calls were received on administrative and alarm lines but treated as 911 calls.
- The remaining 26.7% (6,722) of the phone calls handled by ChatComm 911 in February 2021 were outgoing phone calls.

Overall Phone Call Volume: Since September 2009, ChatComm 911 has answered a total of 2,897,893 incoming phone calls. Of those calls, 1,838,572 (63.4%) were received on 911 trunks and 1,061,480 (36.6%) came in on 10-digit phone lines.

Monthly Incident Volume: ChatComm 911 handled a total of 31,493 incidents in February 2021.

- 65.5% (20,638) of the incidents created were officer-initiated incidents, which include traffic stops, business & residential checks, and other calls created by officers.
- 30.8% (9,709) of the incidents were dispatched incidents.
- The remaining 1,146 (3.7%) of the incidents were transferred via CAD to Dekalb for EMS and Fire Dispatch.
- Sandy Springs incidents comprised 39% (12,448) of the total incident volume. o 9,858 incidents were Sandy Springs Police Department incidents.

Overall Incident Volume: By the end of February 2021, ChatComm 911 handled 3,967,113 incidents since "go-live" in September 2009. 3,527,651 (89%) of those were law enforcement incidents; 247,907 (6.3%) of those were fire department incidents; and 188,465 (4.7%) of those were EMS incidents.

Finance

February 28, 2021 Financial Report in Brief

The February financial statements are presented in comparative form to provide context regarding various revenues and expenditures that are "seasonal" in nature. The significant General Fund revenues that are not typically received each month include (1) property taxes (billed Sept 1 and collected thereafter), (2) franchise fees (larger utility provider remits in 1st quarter of year with other utilities remitting quarterly), (3) business and occupational taxes (renewals are due April 30th), (4) insurance premium tax and fees (collected and remitted by State; Oct 15th), and (5) alcohol licenses. Operationally, the expenditures are not subject to "seasonal" variances, but the acquisition of capital items can be arbitrary from one year to the next.

General Fund Summary

Total General Fund revenues through February 2021 were \$95,452 less than they were this time last fiscal year. Property Tax and Motor Vehicle and Title Ad Valorem Tax (TAVT) increased by \$102,744 and \$165,255 compared to this time in the prior year due to DeKalb County delaying weekly distributions in the prior fiscal year. Fines & Forfeitures decreased by \$104,034 compared to the prior fiscal year at this time due to the continuing negative impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Licenses & Permits decreased by \$97,010 compared to this time in the prior year due to decrease in building permits revenue. Investment earnings decreased by \$66,685 compared to this time in the prior year due to significant drops in interest rates. Charges for services were \$36,764 less than this time in the prior year due to significant decrease in special assessment fees collected. Other financing sources decreased by \$30,560 compared to the prior year due to decrease in Hotel Motel revenue. Energy Excise tax decreased by \$26,360 due to DeKalb County not making any monthly distribution to the City for the current fiscal year.

General Fund expenditures decreased compared to last year at this time by \$196,728. The General Government expenditures decreased by \$210,597 compared to the previous fiscal year at this time primarily due to decreases in expenditures in the City Manager, Finance, and IT Departments. Expenditures for Economic Development decreased by \$97,131 mainly due to significant marketing expenditures incurred in the prior year. The expenditures for the Judicial function decreased by \$68,826 mainly due to decrease in distributions to outside agencies. Culture and Recreation expenditures increased by \$166,614 compared to this time in the prior year mainly due to initial capital cost expenditures in machinery and equipment.





General Fund Balance Reserves

The City has reserved a portion of fund balance to account for City programs. The Tree Fund, Sidewalk Fund, and Police Donations are three examples of City programs that are preserved in the general fund.

Tree Fund Conservancy

Established via City Ordinance, Chapter 14, Section 14-47, the receipts or contributions are part of the "alternative compliance" with the City's tree ordinance. It is only after determination that recompense trees do not fit on a redeveloped site, would a contribution be made. Expenses are basically limited to the purchase/installation of trees in parks, right-of-ways, and other City-owned or leased property.
