

Open /Close by Day




- Of the 155 service requests that were created, 104 have been closed (this includes duplicate requests) with 51 remaining open.

- To date, there are 2,225 registered Brookhaven Connect users; this represents an increase of 95 users since the beginning of the year.







ChatComm 911 Executive Overview April 1, 2021 – April 30, 2021

911 Answer Time: In April 2021, ChatComm 911 answered 94.5% of all incoming phone calls within ten seconds and 99% of all incoming phone calls were answered within thirty seconds.

Call Processing Time: This Month, ChatComm 911 processed 98.6% of all high priority calls for service and 94.6% of all low priority calls for service within sixty seconds.

Monthly Phone Call Volume: For the month of April 2021, ChatComm 911 handled a total of 29,187 phone calls. 72.5% (21,173) were incoming phone calls which are treated as potential emergencies and handled as 911 calls regardless of the line the call is received on. o 12,563 of those calls were received on the 911 trunks. 2,014 of the 911 calls received were abandoned 911 calls (where the caller disconnects the line prior to speaking with a call taker).

6,596 calls were received on administrative and alarm lines but treated as 911 calls.

The remaining 27.5% (8,014) of the phone calls handled by ChatComm 911 in April 2021 were outgoing phone calls.

Overall Phone Call Volume: Since September 2009, ChatComm 911 has answered a total of 2,940,612 incoming phone calls. Of those calls, 1,866,042 (63.5%) were received on 911 trunks and 1,074,715 (36.5%) came in on 10-digit phone lines.

Monthly Incident Volume: ChatComm 911 handled a total of 29,495 incidents in April 2021.

58.6% (17,275) of the incidents created were officer-initiated incidents, which include traffic stops, business & residential checks, and other calls created by officers.

33.7% (9,942) of the incidents were dispatched incidents.

The remaining 1,190 (4%) of the incidents were transferred via CAD to Dekalb for EMS and Fire Dispatch. Sandy Springs incidents comprised 37.1% (10,955) of the total incident volume. • 8,653 incidents were Sandy Springs Police Department incidents.

- 1,303 incidents were for Sandy Springs Fire Rescue.
- 999 incidents were EMS calls for service in Sandy Springs.

Johns Creek incidents were 22.8% (6,727) of the total incident volume.

- 6009 incidents were Johns Creek Police Department incidents.
- 412 incidents were for Johns Creek Fire Department.
- 306 incidents were EMS calls for service in Johns Creek.

Dunwoody incidents accounted for 13% (3,837) of the total incident volume.

Brookhaven incidents were 23% (6,786) of the total incident volume.

Dekalb Fire and EMS (for the Cities of Brookhaven and Dunwoody) incidents were 4.1% (1,190) of the total incident volume.

- 672 incidents were Fire calls for service in Brookhaven or Dunwoody
- 518 incidents were EMS calls for service in Brookhaven or Dunwoody.

Overall Incident Volume: By the end of April 2021, ChatComm 911 handled 4,028,599 incidents since "go-live" in September 2009. 3,580,645 (89%) of those were law enforcement incidents; 252,694 (6.3%) of those were fire department incidents; and 192,170 (4.7%) of those were EMS incidents.

EMD & EFD Compliance: For the month of April 2021, the quality assurance compliance score for EMD remains in compliance with levels set forth by the International Academies of Emergency Dispatch (90%).

Finance

April 30, 2021 Financial Report in Brief

The April financial statements are presented in comparative form to provide context regarding various revenues and expenditures that are "seasonal" in nature. The significant General Fund revenues that are not typically received each month include (1) property taxes (billed Sept 1 and collected thereafter), (2) franchise fees (larger utility provider remits in 1st quarter of year with other utilities remitting quarterly), (3) business and occupational taxes (renewals are due April 30th), (4) insurance premium tax and fees (collected and remitted by State; Oct 15th), and (5) alcohol licenses. Operationally, the expenditures are not subject to "seasonal" variances, but the acquisition of capital items can be arbitrary from one year to the next.

General Fund Summary

Total General Fund revenues through April 2021 were \$1,342,329 more than they were this time last fiscal year. This is mainly due to increases in Licenses & Permits and Motor Vehicle and Title Ad Valorem Tax (TAVT) by \$1,185,997 and \$443,335 compared to this time in the prior year. Licenses & Permits increased primarily due to hospital building & trade permits issued in April 2021 to the Children's Healthcare of Atlanta in the amount of \$1,657,420. The TAVT increase is attributable to DeKalb County delaying distributions in the prior fiscal year. Intergovernmental revenue decreased by \$330,449 compared to this time in the prior year primarily due to the \$400,000 contribution from DeKalb County in 2019 for the purchase of property located in the Brookhaven Heights.

General Fund expenditures decreased compared to last year at this time by \$854,099. Other financing uses decreased by \$523,091 primarily due to the loan made from the General Fund to the Brookhaven Development Authority in the amount of \$650,000 for the acquisition of the Krystal property. The General Government expenditures decreased by \$428,346 compared to the previous fiscal year at this time primarily due to decreases in expenditures in the Finance and IT departments. Public Safety expenditures increased by \$402,848 due to costs associated with personal services and employee benefits. Expenditures for the Housing and Development function decreased by \$140,057 mainly due to April 2021 contracted services invoices not received as of the day of this report. Economic Development expenditures decreased by \$109,867 primarily due to marketing costs incurred in 2019 in the amount of \$76,000.





The City has reserved a portion of fund balance to account for City programs. The Tree Fund, Sidewalk Fund, and Police Donations are three examples of City programs that are preserved in the general fund.

Tree Fund Conservancy

Established via City Ordinance, Chapter 14, Section 14-47, the receipts or contributions are part of the "alternative compliance" with the City's tree ordinance. It is only after determination that recompense trees do not fit on a redeveloped site, would a contribution be made. Expenses are basically limited to the purchase/installation of trees in parks, right-of-ways, and other City-owned or leased property.
