

In response to nationwide business disruptions due to COVID-19, the City of Brookhaven Office of Economic Development has compiled the following list of business resources. Small Business Administration Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program

The Small Business Administration (SBA) is working directly with states whose governors have declared a state of emergency due to COVID-19 to provide Economic Injury Disaster Loans. Governor Kemp declared a state of emergency status for Georgia on March 14th.

As a result, the SBA is providing low-interest loans to Georgia's small businesses and non-profit organizations whose operations have been adversely affected by COVid-19. These working capital loan amounts vary depending on need but can range up to \$2M.

Georgia Department of Labor Emergency Rule 300-2-4-0.5 Partial Claims

On March 16th, the Georgia Department of Labor (GDOL) adopted emergency rules requiring all employers to file partial claims on behalf of their employees whose status has been reduced from part-time to full-time due to COVID-19 related shutdowns. The emergency rules also temporarily suspends the in-person requirements for any Career Center services. Employers found in violation of this rule will be required to pay the GDOL the full amount of unemployment benefits paid to the employee.

The Families First Coronavirus Response Act (HR 6201)
