- A. The following are questions received and City of Brookhaven responses for the above-referenced solicitation:
 - 1. Please clarify how a Restoration Plan (as part of the Management Plan) should be approached? The language requires City participation in order to complete this portion of the plan. Could you please clarify.
 - A: Submit a site-appropriate restoration planting plan with the full proposed plant schedule. Herbaceous plugs and small deep cell or bare-root woody material are preferred. All native.

Also factor in timing and cost.

- 2. Vegetative Debris (pg. 35) Should this material be removed? Left on-site? Mulched? Please clarify as it applies to the fruited material and material that has been chipped per Brookhaven request.
 - A. The section as it is written sufficiently answers these questions for the most part. On site brush piles will be preferred for the most part: "Carbon (organic matter) should be left on site wherever possible". The management plan should attempt to time woody plant (Cherry Laurel, Eleagnus, Privet, etc.) cutting before fruit development; However, the plan must address fruited material as needed, which would preferably be by hauling debris off site or having a control plan for the fruited debris for the following growing season. Spraying volunteer seedlings clustered at piles the following growing season may be another option.
- 3. What are examples of cases where a City of Brookhaven Agent would require chipping? (pg. 35) How should this be priced?
 - If debris piles would be too numerous based on targets and infestation level
 - If proposed as a strategy to suppress invasive regeneration
 - If proposed as a strategy for expeditious soil building and/or erosion control
 - If proposed to utilize for a natural path for patron use and/or improved site access
 - Pricing: to be determined by the bidding contractor
- 4. Could you please clarify the terms of the contract? Length of time/Duration? Start date?
 - A: The term of this contract is (1) one year with (4) four renewal options. The contract will begin upon the approval of the contract.
- 5. Have there been recent surveys of native and non-native plants? Is this information accessible?

 A: No recent biological inventories/surveys exist; However, there is general species composition knowledge of each park.

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- 6. Will maps for each of the 10 parks be provided?
 - A: To be initially developed by the bidding contractor; Possible minor changes to delineated control area/s during coordination with City [Section 1. B.]
- 7. Should the estimate of cost and billing rationale (pg. 38) be calculated by year? or by one lump sum. Please clarify this timeline.
 - A: Cost should be calculated by a yearly lump sum amount. Please see the REVISED Cost Proposal.
- 8. Have there been reports commissioned to establish infestation levels and prescriptive treatment plans in these parks? How do we gain access to these reports previously commissioned?

 A: Commissioned reports do not exist.
- 9. Will the volunteer efforts be focused on those parks with an active conservancy, or does it apply to all parks?
 - A. If a bidding contractor is offering the engagement of volunteer labor within the proposal, volunteer efforts may be proposed for ANY of the parks. Not exclusive to parks with existing conservancy groups.
- 10. Will Brookhaven provide a boundary survey for the parks?
 - A: Yes, Brookhaven can provide boundary/property line maps for the parks.

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11. SMALL AND MINORITY BUSINESSES CLAUSE:

The City of Brookhaven in maintaining its status as a Welcoming City and City of Ethics commissioned a study of its Social Justice, Race, and Equity practices in the past year. As a result of the study, recommendations have been made to the Brookhaven City Council to enhance and improve upon its efforts in providing opportunities to small and minority businesses in procuring goods and services.

With respect to openness and transparency, the City of Brookhaven encourages all businesses regardless of size and status to engage in the City's procurement process. The City gives equal attention to all submissions and will work with individual firms to ensure that their questions are answered in a timely basis.
