


- 1. Blueprint drawings
 - The vendor who wins the bid to create the drawings.
- 2. Water pressure test /Water flow test
 - The private utility contractors to perform the tap themselves under inspections

- 4. Who is responsible for tying the fire alarm?
- Mitech fire alarm panel at Briarwood and Lynwood. Ashford Park does not have an alarm system.
- 5. Ashford Center
 - Who is responsible for patching a painting of sheetrock ceilings in P/R?
 - Brookhaven will work the sheetrock.
 - Can piping be exposed?
 - We would rather have them exposed in case of leaks or freezing in the future.
- 6. Hours and time for work
 - Normal business hours, M-F 7 am-7 pm. The weekend or night work we can approve.
- 7. General Contractor license?
 - Vendor to have a license for contracting work.
- 8. Designator area for tools area?
 - Brookhaven will provide a storage room.
- 9. Sprinkler Valve controls
 - -Fire Marshall: <u>Joe.Burge@brookavenga.gov</u>
- 10. Civil plans to show the water lines; 4-inch main to tap into
 - Requires an 8-inch main
 - The above requirement is defaulted on by the state for waterlines.
- 11. Need Bonds for this project?
 - What type of Pipe Material? Black Pipe
 - NO CBPC PIPE (protected from freezing temperatures) approved by city officials
 - NO dry pipe sprinkler systems
- 12. Is the Briarwood Pool Room included?
 - Pool rooms will not be used for emergency shelter.
