BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City of Brookhaven is studying Ashford Dunwoody Road between the City Limits near I-285 and Peachtree Road. The **purpose of the study** is to develop a future vision for a multimodal corridor that:

- Serves the **needs of all users** of the corridor;
- Is **harmonious** with existing development and future growth along the corridor;
- Minimizes negative impacts to property owners and neighborhoods along the corridor;
- Is **cost-effective** and **implementable**; and
- Has **broad community support** from citizens, stakeholders, and other partners.

The project began with a meeting of the **Corridor Advisory Committee** in February 2016 followed by two stakeholder meetings in March to get input on potential issues and the community's vision for the corridor from City residents and corridor users. This information was be used to refine a set of **goals** and a **series of potential cross-sections** for Ashford Dunwoody Road that address the movement of vehicles, pedestrians, cyclists, and potential transit riders, consistent with the character of development along the corridor. These cross-sections are being presented to the public at this **community workshop**.

Next, the project team will refine recommendations based on the input received at the workshop. The recommended **corridor vision will be presented to the City Council** this fall. For more information visit http://brookhavenga.gov.
