



# Q1 Is your business located in the City of Brookhaven?





### Q2 How many people are employed in your business?









# Q6 Did you win the contract for goods and services for which your business made a proposal?





# Q7 Did you understand the final outcome of the procurement decision?





# Q8 Are you aware of the City of Brookhaven's procurement process?





### Q9 Were the requests for goods or services explained in clear language?



# Q10 Were the requirements to provide goods or services too burdensome?





# Q11 Was the website too difficult to use?



Our committee also implemented a 15- question survey of vendors involved in the procurement process with the City, both those who had been awarded contracts and those who had not. We received 33 responses to the survey, of which 15 were minority- or women-owned businesses.

Торіс	The 4th identified phase of the Procurement & Contracting Process focuses on the decision as to which business will be awarded the contract for a particular project or service.			
Background	In the 2020 fiscal year, a total of 53 contracts were awarded by the City of Brookhaven. Contracts solicited and awarded by th city were divided by the city into 9 categories (see table for full list of categories). The majority (n=29, 54.7%) of contracts were categorized as Site Preparation & Construction. The next largest category was listed as Professional Services-Other (n=6 The majority of the spending by the city was on contracts classified as Site Preparation & Construction, a total of \$16.4 Million which represents 56.3% of all expenses. The average award across all contracts was \$549,081.92 (see table). Of these contracts 0 were awarded to businesses owned by residents of the City of Brookhaven.			
Issue, Inequity, and/or Problem	Of the 53 contracts awarded in the 2020 fiscal year, only 4 (7.5%) of all contracts were awarded to business that were identified as "minority-owned." This translates to a total of \$657,997.24 or 2.2% of all expenses procured by the City of Brookhaven in the 2020 fiscal year. These findings alone demonstrate a substantial inequity in the procurement and contracting process that the city must remedy by committing to award more contracts to minority-owned businesses.			
Rationale	In seeking to address the inequitable distribution of contracts and financial awards by the City of Brookhaven, this recommendation provides concrete targets and expected benchmarks that the city should meet to approach an equitable procurement and contracting process. Specified targets should			

	be seen as a starting point and not a minimum quota to be met to check a box.
Considerations	While businesses classified as minority-owned may refer to those owned by individuals who are minoritized based on gender, race, or a combination, the recommendation should not be met by awarding contracts disproportionately to businesses owned by white women.
Recommendation	Starting in the first year of implementation, the City of Brookhaven should commit to awarding 33.3% of all funds spent by the city on procurement and contracting to businesses identified as minority owned. Each subsequent year the city should aim to increase this percentage by at least 5% per year.
