5.8	Increased engagement efforts in the Latino community through social media and partnerships, raising the numbers of followers by roughly 200% (as of July 31, 2020)

5.11	Engaged multiple outreach groups to enhance communication with traditionally “hard to count” households burdened with language difficulties and lack of internet
